Minutes for the meeting April 11th 2024

Dave Wood introduced our speaker Lou Viackus MD of Dartmouth Hitchcock and the Geisel School of Medicine.

Lou spoke on the role of Artificial Intelligence in Medicine. AI as currently being worked on is a very complicated topic. Lou presented the theory behind it and its developmental use at Dartmouth to enhance the doctors' ability to prescribe treatments for cancer patients and how its use will expand in coming years. The lecture was a doctorate quality exposition on the subject and how it will assist the medical profession in diagnostics going forward. The subject matter was beyond the non-medical capabilities of your Secretary, but suffice it to say it was a scholarly presentation that the membership appreciated and enjoyed.
