Minutes for the Meeting of August 10th, 2023

- Garry Keane, President called the meeting to Order at Noon. The lack of a coherent energy policy by the government the last two years has led to ever increasing prices for the traditional sources of energy. The current government has been pushing alternative energy options including windmills, solar and other renewables. The government is pushing for windmills both off-shore and on land. Solar has been a more popular option and appears well suited as an alternative in the Southern part of the U.S. Nuclear power, which many view as practical, was not discussed. Hydro-electric power, which is in great supply from Canada, has been an issue for New Hampshire for years. Jamie Hess 's informative speech also highlighted the Community Energy Coalition initiative which will provide a 10% saving on electric bills when available in 2024 to New London and other supporting towns.

Jamie's excellent discussion covered the issues in great depth and we thank him for his timely speech.

Dave Wood announced that next month's speaker would be Dan Dailey who will give a presentation on glass blowing and glassware.

After the meeting the Executive Council met and discussed several issues:

Any changes to the Dress Code? General consensus was no with the feeling that "business casual" should continue and that inappropriate dress discouraged with more formal attire preferred for the two annual events that include spouses.
