Minutes of the March 9 meeting:

The center piece speaker, Jeremy DeSilva, visiting us now for the third time, made this one of our very best meetings. Joe Watts, president, opened the meeting at noon calling close to 50 members together, and turned to Jerry Coogan for the "Words of Inspiration." Jerry honored the coming of St. Patrick's Day with the traditional Irish Blessing.
